The great wharenui Te Hau-ki-Tūranga, now in the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa in Wellington, was built in 1842 at Orakaiaapu in Manutūke It is the oldest surviving building of its kind in the world and an exemplar of the work of Rongowhakaata Master Carver, Raharuhi Rukupō.

Alongside the Ko Rongowhakaata Iwi Exhibition at Te Papa, the Rongowhakaata Iwi Trust have agreed to undertake the restoration of Te Hau ki Tūranga. The restoration will be managed by the Rongowhakaata Iwi Trust.

We are now seeking a Project Manager to undertake the following tasks:

- Development of a methodology for the restoration and recreation of Te Hau Ki Tūranga;
- Development of a comprehensive project plan and budget for the restoration and recreation of Te Hau Ki Tūranga;
- Report to project steering group and RIT General Manager;
- Recruitment and management of restoration team members including; Lead Carver, Weaver and Kowhaiwhai Artist;
- Oversight of the development and implementation of project communications plan;
- Oversight of restoration deliverables as defined in project plan; and
- Report to Rongowhakaata Iwi Reference Group (RIRG), RIT Board Trust, Ministry for Culture and Heritage and Lotteries New Zealand.

This position does not include responsibility for wider matters pertaining to Te Hau ki Tūranga, including the referendum and feasibility reports on the potential return of the whare whakairo to Tūranga.

- Project and capability management
- Stakeholder relationship management
- Resource management
- Health & Safety management
- Risk management
